



2007 International Baccalaureate Results

The nine students who completed the IB in 2007 deserve hearty congratulations for their outstanding results. The entire IB cohort gained a University Admissions Index above 94 and the average UAI for the IB group was 98.18.

Georgia Sullivan received full marks (45 out of 45) and a corresponding UAI of 99.95. Only ten students in Australia gained full marks in the 2007 IB and, what is most illuminating, only twenty in the world. Georgia is certainly part of an elite group. We congratulate her as she prepares to study at Oxford University, having been awarded a full scholarship to study there.

Mary-Beth Beirne, Olivia Rothnie-Jones and Naomi Van Groll gained 43 out of 45 and a corresponding UAI of 99.80.

The UAIs for 2007

The UAI is a single index that ranks HSC students in the State. The IB uses a table to convert students' total scores in all their IB subjects to a UAI rank. The following data indicates just how well our HSC and IB students performed:

- 29% of HSC and IB students gained a UAI over 95
- 47% of HSC and IB students gained a UAI above 90
- 76% of HSC and IB students gained a UAI above 80
- The top UAI was 99.95
