Debating

This challenging and highly rewarding extracurricular activity involves the art of constructing and presenting a formal argument to an opposing team, adjudicator and audience. Students are required to use general knowledge, reasoning and higher order thinking to consider contemporary issues relevant to modern society. A specialist debating coach works with the debating teams each week providing insight and expertise to support the students in developing their debating skills. In 2020, Queenwood aims to enter two debating competitions as outlined below.

ISDA Competition

YEARS 5 & 6

Queenwood enters up to two teams of six students in the prestigious Independent Schools Debating Competition held during Terms 1& 2. Topics include current political, social and environmental issues. Debaters have one hour before the debate to deliberate on a previously unseen topic and prepare a case. Teams are challenged to brainstorm and critically examine various aspects of the topic before preparing arguments with a view from either an affirmative or negative perspective.

The commitment required is significant. Debates are held every Friday evening from approximately 5 – 7pm at various independent schools in Sydney. Students are required to make their way to the Senior School by 4:45pm for home debates, and will be transported to away debates by bus.



Queenwood's music philosophy is to encourage active participants rather than passive listeners. The choral, instrumental and classroom programs provide performance opportunities for every student. All girls in Years 3-6 play an instrument in the fully differentiated Instrumental Music Program. Every student is placed in a class or ensemble with students of equal playing and music reading ability. Small group lessons and ensemble rehearsals are scheduled once a week and each girl attends one of these sessions. Students who are progressing well can be accelerated into one of the more advanced classes or ensembles. We aim to provide opportunities for all students and to give them as broad a range of musical experiences as possible.

Extracurricular Music Lessons

YEARS K – 6

Specialist teachers deliver extracurricular lessons in piano, traditional orchestra and band instruments, voice and musicianship. Lessons are on a rotational system throughout the school day with a fixed, out of school lesson time available only to students learning two instruments. Parents may choose to sign up for 15 semester lessons or 30 lessons for a full year.

There are some considerations you must be aware of when choosing an instrument for your daughter. These include height, hand/finger size and shape, mouth and/or lip shape etc. The specialist music teachers are more than happy to do a short assessment in order to provide expert advice to assist with this decision.
