**Debating** YEARS 5-6

This challenging and highly rewarding extra-curricular activity involves the art of constructing and presenting a formal argument to an opposing team, adjudicator and audience. The students are required to use their general knowledge, skills of reasoning and higher order thinking processes to consider contemporary issues relevant to modern society. A specialist debating coach works with the debating teams each week providing insight and expertise to support the students in developing their debating skills. In 2018, Queenwood aims to enter two debating competitions as outlined below.

### ISDA Competition YEARS 5-6

Queenwood has the option to enter up to two teams of six students in the prestigious Independent Schools Debating Competition held during Terms 1 and 2. Topics include current political, social and environmental issues. Debaters have one hour before the debate to deliberate on a previously unseen topic and prepare a case. Teams are challenged to brainstorm and critically examine various aspects of the topic before preparing arguments with a view from either an affirmative or negative perspective.

The commitment required to participate in this competition both from students and parents is significant. Debates are held every Friday evening from approximately 5-7pm at various independent schools in Sydney. Students are required to make their way to the Senior School by 4:45pm for home debates, and will be transported to away debates by bus.

### **Private Tuition** YEARS K-6
